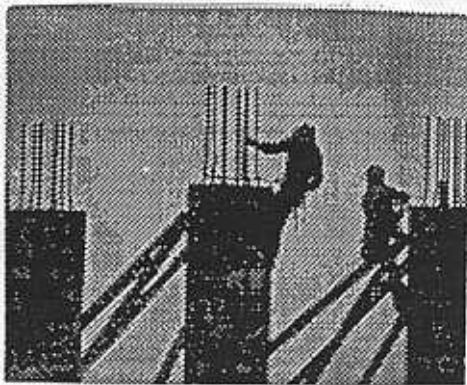


"Smell" cont'd

4000 Delridge

The project at 4000 Delridge (SW side of Delridge and Andover) is scheduled to begin clearing and construction within a few weeks, subject to getting the final permits. Involvement by the Council and neighbors during the design review process resulted in a number of changes which should make this a good addition to the neighborhood, among them a new bus shelter, improved sidewalks, and street-side plantings. This will be an owner-occupied building, which means that they have a vested interest in being good neighbors and in keeping the building and surrounding area looking nice.
